Narrative:

Neighborhood canvas - 103 supplemental

On November 14, 2022 at approximately 1000 hours, I responded back to 1122 King Rd to conduct a neighborhood canvas in the daylight. Chief Fry was with me. We started from the rear of the residence and covered the small hill area just behind 1122 King Rd. Right behind the residence there was a small black bag that had obviously been out in the weather for some time. There was nothing in it. We searched up to the parking lot of [REDACTED] Queen Rd then worked southwest along the hillside below the parking lot. We searched the fenced backyard of [REDACTED] Walenta Dr. and continued west above [REDACTED] King Rd.

From there I was joined by Sgt. Gunderson and we went through the south side of [REDACTED] King Rd, around the back then back west between [REDACTED] King Rd. and [REDACTED] King Rd. I worked over to Queen Rd. going north then between [REDACTED] Queen Rd. and [REDACTED] King Rd. out to Taylor Ave. We crossed the open play field from Taylor Ave, north to Nez Perce Dr. at the crosswalk near [REDACTED]. We walked the pathway north to the WWI Memorial grove and stopped at that point.

I returned to the intersection of Taylor Ave. and King Rd. where I met with Chief Fry again. From that point we proceeded east along the south side of Taylor Ave. looking in the shrubbery and around the cars parked along the curb. At the entrance to the parking lot of [REDACTED] Taylor Ave. I located a black vest laying on the grass next to the fire hydrant. The vest appeared to be weathered with leaves and debris on it. It appeared to have been there for several days. I checked the pockets and examined the vest but did not find anything of note. As we continued to walk east along the south side of Taylor Ave. I noted a large amount of trash and various items on the grass and in the bushes including; various glass and plastic bottles, pipes of various types, some articles of clothing such as T-shirt and underwear (men's and women's) and various papers and litter. All appeared to have been in the area for several day or weeks and I did not determine any evidentiary value for any items I saw.

From there I went south down Linda Ln. and walked west between [REDACTED] Taylor Ave. and [REDACTED] Linda Ln. then north of the eastern most building of [REDACTED] Queen Rd. Then up to the parking lot on the north side of Queen Rd. back to [REDACTED] Queen Rd. where I started.
