Narrative

1. On December 6, 2022, ISP Sergeant Tim Hopkins and I interviewed [REDACTED] reference the November 13th quadruple homicide in Moscow, Idaho, at the Idaho State Police District 3 Office. The interview began at approximately 11:00 a.m. and [REDACTED] was accompanied by his mother, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] reported the following:

2. The interview began with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] himself discussing the on-line and social media harassment their family has been dealing with since Sunday. [REDACTED] informed me their family friends and

even her medical practice is now being pulled into the on-line rumors.

3. I informed [REDACTED] I wanted to focus on the days prior to the homicide. [REDACTED] described the days prior as the usual. He went out to the bars on Thursday night for "early weekend", then stayed home Friday to recover from a hangover and complete some school assignments. He then went out and drank on Saturday and stayed home to recover and watch football on Sunday. It was a typical weekend, and he can't remember that weekend being any different.
4. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew about the sorority formal on Friday. [REDACTED] said maybe, but he really does not pay attention to such activities. He stated there is always something happening on campus, and he does not follow all the activities.
5. I asked [REDACTED] if he was aware there was a party at the house where the homicide occurred (1122 King St., Moscow, Idaho) on Friday night. [REDACTED] said he was unaware of a party on Friday but thought there was a party at the house on game day, Saturday. However, he was not sure there was a party at that house because there were 6-7 houses on King Street on that Saturday having parties. [REDACTED] only went to the parties at the [REDACTED] building on game day (Saturday). [REDACTED] rarely attended such parties because many times there are freshmen and sophomores at such parties, and he does not like partying with the younger underclassmen. [REDACTED] usually stayed at his own apartment, attended functions at his fraternity, [REDACTED] or went to the bars. Therefore, [REDACTED] does not pay a lot of attention to parties off campus.
6. I asked [REDACTED] to walk me through his entire day on Saturday, November 12, 2022. [REDACTED] informed us it was difficult since he was drinking all day that day. He did not attend the game but did go to the party at the [REDACTED]. He went back to his apartment then later out to the bars. [REDACTED] claimed he did not remember a lot of specifics but there were people everywhere. He knew some of the people many he did not know.
7. [REDACTED] explained for the first three years of college he had a girlfriend and was in a relationship. He did not really party and meet a lot of people during that time, he spent most of his time working on the relationship. As a result, [REDACTED] does not know the number of people other seniors do and he does not talk to the individuals he does not know. [REDACTED] believed since he does not know a lot of people and does not talk to a lot of people, he has a "sus" (suspect) reputation. [REDACTED] preferred to hang out with friends, if he does not know someone, he does not talk to them.
8. I then asked [REDACTED] if he was with [REDACTED] on Saturday. [REDACTED] said yes and described [REDACTED] as his good friend. [REDACTED] could not recall when he met up with [REDACTED] that day, but he believed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came to his apartment then they all went to the party at the [REDACTED].
9. [REDACTED] then looked at his phone and found a text message string between he and [REDACTED] (Same text message string FBI Agent O'Neal photographed on [REDACTED] phone) The first text was sent by [REDACTED] on Saturday at 4:16 p.m. to [REDACTED]. It simply said, "YO". [REDACTED] replied "Wasssup", and [REDACTED] asked if [REDACTED] was still at the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] informed him he was, and he was going to get some food. [REDACTED] asked where [REDACTED] was, and [REDACTED] informed him he was back at his apartment getting ibuprofen for his back. [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] to grab him a couple of beers if there were any left. (This was the last text message between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on Saturday)
10. After reviewing the text string, I informed [REDACTED] it appeared he and [REDACTED] had been at the party prior to the start of the text string. [REDACTED] believed they went to the party at the [REDACTED] around 1-2 p.m. but he could not recall the exact time. He did recall seeing Maddi Mogen and Kaylee Goncalves and all the residents of 1122 King St. going outside and taking the photograph everyone sees now.
11. [REDACTED] knew Maddi the best. He had known her since his freshman year because they had classes together and she would hang out at the [REDACTED] fraternity house.
12. [REDACTED] said while attending the party at the [REDACTED] he made several trips to his apartment to stretch and deal with his sore back. [REDACTED] claimed after the text string with [REDACTED] began, he did not return

to the party at the [REDACTED]

13. I asked [REDACTED] if he remembered going to the [REDACTED] house with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] replied not really, then said that is why he agreed to go to the other bar with Kaylee and Maddi when they asked. He does the same thing every weekend and it is hard to remember.

14. I confronted [REDACTED] with the information we had gathered reference he and [REDACTED] had been picked up by a fraternity "DD" (designated driver), driven to get food and beer then dropped off at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] fraternity house. [REDACTED] responded, that would not be out of the normal, but did specifically recall.

15. Sergeant Hopkins asked [REDACTED] about purchasing a 30 pack of beer and splitting the beers between himself and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not recall if they purchased a 30 pack on Saturday, but it was normal for him and [REDACTED] to purchase beer and split it up between the two of them. He could not remember if they did it that Saturday because they were drinking all day. Sergeant Hopkins asked what type of beer they typically purchased, and [REDACTED] informed us it was usually Keystone, Natural Ice, or any cheap lager beer.

16. I instructed [REDACTED] to refer to the text string between himself and [REDACTED] and look at some of the communications on Monday, specifically where he was asking [REDACTED] if he wanted the bag back. [REDACTED] read the text string, then remembered he did borrow a bag from [REDACTED] that Saturday. He and [REDACTED] were at the [REDACTED] house and [REDACTED] had passed out. [REDACTED] took a bag from [REDACTED] and filled it with approximately 15 beers. He believed he went back to his apartment because the bag was at his apartment, and he had to return the bag to [REDACTED]

17. [REDACTED] did not see [REDACTED] again that day or night because [REDACTED] went to the bars and [REDACTED] did not.

18. I asked [REDACTED] how he got from his apartment to the Corner Club. [REDACTED] responded probably a "DD" (Designated Driver).

19. [REDACTED] did not recall the clothing [REDACTED] was wearing Saturday the 12th.

20. The next contact [REDACTED] had with [REDACTED] was Sunday morning sometime. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was with [REDACTED] driving to get some food. [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] and asked what was going on at the house down the street from [REDACTED] apartment. [REDACTED] indicated he already told us what happened after that in his previous interview.

21. [REDACTED] could not remember anything out of the normal that weekend. He had said goodbye to Maddi and thought he would see her in class after they got picked up at the food truck.

22. [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as laid back and quiet, if people don't know him well, they would view him as an "outsider". [REDACTED] is very quiet and will not open up unless he knows you. [REDACTED] said, "[REDACTED] is a great guy and knows he would not have done this shit for sure". They have been friends since the 7th grade, they attended [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and U of I together. [REDACTED] has always had [REDACTED] back and [REDACTED] described [REDACTED] as a "ride or die" buddy.

23. [REDACTED] informed us Maddi cared about [REDACTED] because they used to be close. [REDACTED] and Maddi had an on again off again [REDACTED] relationship in the past. It worked for [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] did not want a girlfriend, but [REDACTED] claimed it was difficult to describe because [REDACTED] did not really talk about "those things" or brag about girls.

24. [REDACTED] knew [REDACTED] and Maddi had gone on a trip to Cabo, Mexico with a large group of U of I students during spring break last year. [REDACTED] did not go but the trip which was arranged by a guy in the [REDACTED] fraternity.

25. [REDACTED] did not have a sexual relationship with anyone else living in the 1122 King Street house.

26. Xana Kernodle had been in past relationships with [REDACTED] and another guy [REDACTED] did not know but she appeared happy with Ethan Chapin. [REDACTED] did not know Kaylee and didn't know she used to date the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (Known to be [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] did not know [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]

- He indicated he may recognize them if he saw a photograph, but he does not know them. The only individual he really knew from the house was Maddi due to mutual classes together.
27. [REDACTED] did not know the number of times [REDACTED] had been inside the 1122 King Street residence. Especially since [REDACTED] had been banned from the Corner Club for a while and [REDACTED] did not know what [REDACTED] was doing while [REDACTED] continued to frequent the bar.
28. [REDACTED] expanded on [REDACTED] ban at the Corner Club. He indicated there was a two-strike system at the bar and after you had two strikes, you were banned by the bar for a period of time. [REDACTED] admitted it was his fault for [REDACTED] being banned and, they both should only have one strike. [REDACTED] admitted he and [REDACTED] are "hot heads" and will hold their ground. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] already had one strike at the Corner Club for arguing with the bartender, when [REDACTED] got drunk at the bar and began arguing with the boyfriend of a girl he liked. The argument escalated and [REDACTED] pushed the boyfriend. The bartenders broke up the argument and blamed [REDACTED]. As a result, [REDACTED] received his second strike and was banned from the Corner Club until February.
29. [REDACTED] admitted he and [REDACTED] have gotten into fights with other individuals. He explained they don't look to hurt people; they are generally drunken arguments and most of the time they involve individuals from other fraternities.
30. I asked [REDACTED] if he noticed any strange alumni or strangers while attending the party at the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] did not recall seeing anyone out of place while he was at the party or at the Corner Club.
31. [REDACTED] said after the girls were picked up from the food truck, he did not want to wait for a ride and did not even know if his "DD" (designated driver) was even still accepting calls, so he walked home. [REDACTED] informed us it was no big deal to walk home. When they were at the food truck, he believed he and the girls were going to another bar, but they were drunk and got a ride home he presumed.
32. Due to the homicides and the rumor circulating around campus that classes could go on-line, he made the decision to return to Boise. On his way out of town he stopped and saw [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] returned the bag he had taken to transport the beer on Saturday and a HDMI cable he had borrowed to watch football.
33. [REDACTED] was active in the [REDACTED] fraternity. [REDACTED] lived at the fraternity house, paid rent, and his dues. [REDACTED] was also the [REDACTED] for the [REDACTED] fraternity. [REDACTED] is also a [REDACTED] member and has been since his freshman year. [REDACTED] only pays his dues which gives him access to the fraternity and one meal a week. [REDACTED] usually eats at the fraternity house on Mondays because the house chapter meetings are conducted every Monday.
34. Sergeant Hopkins and I asked about the house known as [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] informed us [REDACTED] is an off-campus house associated with the [REDACTED] fraternity. Upper classmen often transition out of the fraternity house and move into [REDACTED]. Sometimes other individuals will rent a room at the house, at one time a football player was living there and even a professor stayed there for a while.
35. I asked [REDACTED] if he had any knowledge about Kaylee having a [REDACTED] relationship with a [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he had heard rumors but thought they were weird because the rumor he had heard was Kaylee was involved with a [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] and he understood Kaylee was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] believed it to be an outlandish rumor and it would be more believable if it was a [REDACTED].
36. [REDACTED] again informed us he did not really know Kaylee and did not know if she had a job. His only connection to Kaylee was due to knowing Maddi. [REDACTED] did not even initially know Kaylee was the girl with Maddi at the Corner Club on Saturday night. It was a chance encounter seeing Maddi at the bar and he had been talking with only Maddi. It was Maddi that invited him to go with them to Johns Alley to get some food, but they decided to get food at the food truck.
37. Since returning to Boise, [REDACTED] has been hanging out at home playing X-Box. He has gone out to the bars with [REDACTED] a couple of times but has been staying at his house most of the time. [REDACTED] did inform [REDACTED] someone had called a tip into the police pretending to be his mother.

38. ██████████ discussed some of the internet rumors accusing him of the homicides. Everyone continues to ask him what happened that night and he informs them he has no idea. He has always thought the students would figure out who committed the homicides before the police because they know the community better than the police. Now that the homicides have not been solved and the students do not know who committed the crime, everyone is scared.

39. Sergeant Hopkins and I asked ██████████ about the most recent issues resulting in ██████████ for ██████████ ██████████ informed us a video of freshman hazing other freshman was the most recent issue. A parent had seen a video of freshmen throwing another freshman's bed out of the fraternity house second floor window. Sergeant Hopkins asked about issues at a sorority function. According to ██████████ there were two issues at the sororities off campus function. The first involved ██████████ and ██████████ was picking on a guy at the party calling him Kermit the frog. Eventually a scuffle broke out and ██████████ was just backing up ██████████ once the scuffle started. The other incident at the same party involved a couple of ██████████ freshmen throwing hangers and causing damage to the facility. These issues did not cause trouble for the ██████████ fraternity since it was not a ██████████ function, but the individuals involved are in trouble themselves.

40. At the end of the interview, I asked ██████████ if he would consent to us getting a set of major crime fingerprints from him before he left. ██████████ agreed and ISP Forensics printed ██████████ At approximately 1:32 p.m., the major crime prints were completed, and ██████████ left the District 3 Office.
