Narrative

1. On 9th January, 2023 at about 1405 hours, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Detective (Det.) Sean Prosser along with ISP Det. Gary Tolleson interviewed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in connection with her knowledge and interactions with Bryan KOHBERGER. The interview took place at the [REDACTED] (Rm [REDACTED]), [REDACTED] in Pullman, WA. Also present during the interview was Washington State Assistant Attorney General Adam Malcolm.

2. Prior to the start of the interview [REDACTED] confirmed she was happy for the interview to be recorded. This recording was subsequently downloaded to a CD and provided to the Moscow Police Department evidence section.

3. [REDACTED] is employed [REDACTED]. She has held this position for approximately [REDACTED]. During the normal course of her duties she regularly interacted with KOHBERGER; this occurred during new student course orientation, course functions and other course related activities. Additionally, KOHBERGER was present at [REDACTED] during an early semester student meet and greet BBQ [REDACTED]

4. [REDACTED] position also requires she interacts with students to discuss course options and any issues students might have; this includes student interactions with faculty members and other students. As a result she is a repository for complaints made by students.

5. She described her initially interactions with KOHBERGER as ordinary, noting he came across as lonely. [REDACTED] is also from KOHBERGER's home state of Pennsylvania and KOHBERGER would strike up conversations about hiking in the local area.

Narrative

6. As weeks progressed KOHBERGER would hangout in the hallways of the [REDACTED] and her office. [REDACTED] described KOHBERGER as "creepy" and he would simply stand at her desk and stare at her or her co-worker [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at one stage blocking the co-worker in her desk area. He would also follow them out to their cars at the end of the day. His continued behavior resulted [REDACTED] arranging [REDACTED] to meet at 1700 hours after work to escort them to their cars.

7. [REDACTED] said complaints from Faculty Members, Administration Staff and other students was referred to the [REDACTED]. These complaints referenced his rude and belittling behavior toward women and his unprofessional rude dealings with his [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. This resulted in a mandatory training class for all graduate students regarding behavior expectations. She said during KOHBERGER's attendance at this class he sat at the back with his hands behind his head staring at the ceiling.

8. [REDACTED] said in total nine (9) complaints had been filed against KOHBERGER.
