**Narrative**

- On January 9, 2023, at approximately 3:04 p.m. Idaho State Police (ISP) Captain J. Kempf and I, ISP Sergeant J. Stennett, conducted an interview with [REDACTED] reference her knowledge of Bryan C. KOHBERGER (DOB [REDACTED]/1994). The interview took place at the Moscow Police Department, Moscow, Idaho.
- [REDACTED] contacted the Moscow Homicide tip line to report she had observed KOHBERGER with bloody knuckles. She saw the knuckles just prior to the homicides. The hands looked really beat up like he was hitting something.
- She was enrolled as a graduate student with Washington State University in the [REDACTED] program. She had [REDACTED] with KOHBERGER.
- She did not like KOHBERGER, and they did not share the same focus of study.
- She recalled KOHBERGER talking constantly during their [REDACTED] class. He would pick fights with other classmates. She described an argument where [REDACTED] left the class upset.
- She had heard he had an incident with a female professor where KOHBERGER disagreed with the grade he had been given. KOHBERGER went to a male professor to complain about the grade. The female professor was

7. She described KOHBERGER as weird, but he had never threatened her. In one instance after class, KOHBERGER and her were alone. When she was trying to leave the classroom, he blocked her exit. She described him blocking her with his physical stance. KOHBERGER said they should meet up sometime and talk about her professional career. She felt like he just wanted to keep the discussion going even though class was over.
8. After the homicides, KOHBERGER stopped bringing a cell phone to class and started bringing a laptop. She never saw KOHBERGER using the laptop. Prior to the homicides she noticed him always using his phone. Because he was very studious, she believed he would take notes on phone.
9. She described a change in his appearance after the homicides. He would normally be clean shaven and neatly dressed. After the homicides, he would come to class with facial hair and his dress would be disheveled. He also started wearing a thick blue coat that he never took off during a three-hour class. The weather did not really call for a heavy coat.
10. She described KOHBERGER engaging regularly in classroom discussions. After the homicides, the topic was discussed during class. She thought it was odd that KOHBERGER never participated in the discussions about the Moscow homicides. KOHBERGER continued to engage in other discussions and appeared to be more cheerful.
11. She did not know anything about KOHBERGER outside of class.
12. KOHBERGER was always playing the devil's advocate in class.
13. During the semester students were required to read four books. The third book they were required to read was a book about DNA evidence. She recalled KOHBERGER being heavily involved in the discussions about the book in class.
14. KOHBERGER was at a department bar outing at a downtown bar in Pullman, Washington. The outing occurred in October. KOHBERGER purchased a bottle wine and drank the entire bottle.
15. She was aware of a running tally some of the female students had. The tally tracked his tardiness to female instructor led classes versus male instructor led classes. The tally showed he was constantly late to female instructor classes and never late to male instructor classes.
16. She was not aware of other [REDACTED] requesting escorts out of the building because they feared KOHBERGER.
17. At approximately 3:25 p.m. the interview ended. For further details refer to the audio recording of this interview.
